Franklin Dunn Schurz, Sr. (1898-1987), owner and publisher of the South Bend <u>Tribune</u>, and owner of a chain of newspapers and radio/television stations it acquired, was described in a document in the collection as the most influential man in South Bend. This fact, as well as his considerable influence in the newspaper industry nationwide, is amply documented in the items which were selected for this small but valuable collection.

Schurz was born in South Bend, the son of John Giles Schurz, an accountant, and Grace Dunn Schurz, descendant of a local pioneer family. After graduating from South Bend High School, Harvard University and the Harvard Business School, he worked briefly for Stanford University and for his father's firm before joining the Tribune in 1925. He married Martha Montgomery, whom he had met at Stanford, in 1929. F. A. Miller, the Tribune's owner and publisher, who was Martha Schurz's uncle, trained Franklin Schurz in virtually every aspect of the Tribune's operations, and always working in the shadow of his uncle, Schurz took an increasingly prominent role. Among his responsibilities were serving as station manager for the Tribune's radio station WSBT, as business manager of the Tribune, and finally, on the death of Miller, as editor/publisher (1954-72). the Tribune organization he held the offices of vice president (1929-46), secretary and treasurer (1946-57), president (1957-75), and chairman of the board (1975-76).

A pioneer in implementing the automation of various printing processes for newspapers, he was prominent in the research efforts of the American Newspaper Publishers Association and served on the boards of the Associated Press, the Inland Daily Press Association, the Hoosier State Press Association and other organizations. Conspicuously active in community affairs, he chaired the War Finance Committee in St. Joseph County during World War II, and later served as chairman of a number of organizations dedicated to economic development, including, most notably, the Committee of 100 and the St. Joseph County Manpower Development and Training Advisory Committee. He served on many other boards and committees including those of the University of Notre Dame and St. Mary's College.

Three sons and a daughter were born to Franklin and Martha Schurz. All four grew up to become working executives in the Schurz newspaper chain.

Schurz's connection with IUSB included efforts to secure the land for the IUSB campus in the late 1950's, working through the Committee

of 100. In 1976 he was given an honorary doctorate of laws by Indiana University, with the presentation at IUSB's commencement. When the Schurz Library was dedicated in 1990, three years after his death, Schurz's four children attended.

Franklin D. Schurz Papers

Brief Description

The collection documents Schurz's work in business, community and public affairs. With stress on the period between 1950 and 1970, it especially emphasizes his contributions to the automation of printing, local business development, and the retraining of workers displaced by automation and plant reductions and closings. Photos, awards and memorabilia document landmarks in his life, speeches and articles convey his thoughts on a variety of subjects, and correspondence from leading figures in politics and journalism demonstrates the extent of his influence.

Before arriving at the IUSB Archives, this collection was carefully selected from what must have been a massive body of personal and business records. Most materials were organized in subject files, with careful chronological arrangement in most cases.

In March, 1992 the collection was refoldered and placed in a sequence, with some changes from the original filing. (For detail see Processing Notes.) This finding aid was updated in 2018 by archives assistant Madeline Allin. The sequence is as follows:

Processing Notes

When examined in February, 1992, the collection was dispersed over a number of locations. It included five envelope-boxes full of foldered material, as well as part of a drawer of files which the former archivist had transferred to acid-free folders. Some of the larger items had been wrapped and stacked in two different drawers; others were piled on drawer tops. A number of photos and letters had been selected for an exhibit at the Schurz Library opening, put into plastic sleeves and cemented to black paper backing; these were still grouped together, along with two oversize items.

The arrangement of the papers, reportedly by Mr. Schurz's secretary at the Tribune, was overwhelmingly by activity or organization. Chronological arrangement of items within the files and a variety of handwritten notes indicate that many of the papers were carefully selected and organized. Speeches and writings on the subject of journalism and printing were all in one box. Items on manpower retraining and the Studebaker crisis were together. A few items of correspondence were unfiled; some from notable people were put together in a folder. But most were within subject files.

In processing the collection, oversize and framed items were inventoried and placed together in one drawer, wrapping three-dimensional items which had not previously been wrapped. Unframed photos 8x10 or smaller were removed from the files where they had been, and were all placed and inventoried together. Unframed awards and certificates, as well as a few clippings, letters and other items pertaining to awards, also were placed together. Likewise, all speeches and writings were placed together, with photocopies made in some cases for the subject files in which they had been found.

Subject organization was kept for the rest of the materials. Notes were made as to their original arrangement. Some merging of files was done, especially in the case of the Committee of 100 and Manpower Development/ Retraining folders, where there were several folders covering the same period. Publications having to do with the program were placed chronologically, in many cases, with the minutes, correspondence, and other records.

In another case, items concerning equal opportunity and "Great Society" programs, such as South Bend's ACTION program, which were dispersed, were placed together in one file. A new file was created merging several items which told the overall story of South Bend's response to the Studebaker closing crisis. Another file, on biographical sketches of Mr. Schurz, was enlarged, making photocopies of items located in various other files, and placed at the beginning of the sequence.

Exhibit items were interfiled with the other materials, but specially listed. Items of Presidential correspondence and

memorabilia were photocopied so that the originals could be kept in the locked cabinet. - M. Pickrell, 4/14/92
